April was IHC time again and the beginning of Mission Trip 73. This year I was not able to make it to IHC as I stayed home to help with my mom after a previous month of a difficult chemo week for her treatments. Thankfully Amy Hoover who was our office manager at the time and Bryan Witt our Information Technology Manager (IT Manager) represented our mission for us. Thank you Amy and Bryan. Amy also enlisted the help of several of her family members: husband, sister and mother. Thank you to all who helped setup and man the booth. Before I left on the trip we changed our transmission fluid in the motorhome and replaced the pan gasket, unfortunately things went really wrong not long in to the trip and we had to replace the transmission pan also, losing a couple days of traveling due to the problems and repairs. Then a tire blew out in AZ and not too long after that, the front breaks started grinding. These repairs delayed things again. It costs to keep everything in repair on the road. We were thankful

for the brethren who helped with some of the repairs and another who paid his in-house-mechanics to fix the transmission pan.

On the way West I was contacted about helping a new church in Marshfield, MO, so I made an unplanned stop. We analyzed their community and made plans to return for an outreach in late summer.



I do firmly believe God has been touching me continually to keep me going all these years with various health problems.

While home in PA for the 2nd half of July, I attended God's Missionary Church conference and camp meeting around battling the sickness still.

In recent months our IT Manager Bryan Witt has been working on our <u>HolinessMovement.org</u> website and added a Google map system to show where all the Conservative Holiness Church-

es are around the USA. This is a work in progress. We started the site back in 2019 and at that time some denominations and associations decide to list their churches in the site's church directory, others chose not to for various reasons, some because they were not sure they wanted it all out on the internet. But with Covid pushing us out of our technological closet, so to say, we are hopeful more have come to see the need to



be online and the church and group directories will grow.

This https://www.holinessmovement.org/church-map new Google maps system was an eye opener for me. I always knew there were far less CHM churches in the western part of the USA, but when I sawa it on the map, God opened my eyes to fully see the need. Typically I spend part of the year in the West, but more in the East. Now I see the greatest need of evangelism is in the West. So there are some changes coming to our normal operations. The Lord willing, I am planning to be out west more helping churches and working to restart the Salt Lake City church. Please pray for this endeavor. As the Lord leads, I will start transitioning to work more out west and be making fewer trips back East. I am planning to be operating more out of the Salt Lake City area. Then I can help with the new church more, and be closer to make a few trips to the various western states to aid existing churches with outreach & evangelism. The need is great!

I asked some questions above: Why is only ½ of the USA covered with red dots? And Wha'cha gonna do about it?

Well the obvious answers is there are less churches, but what is the real reason... WHY? Why are there less churches? Yes, some states have less people, but it really comes down to: The Laborers are few! So what are you going to do about it?

There are many things you can do to help, but I want you to consider these two as a priority. One, we need workers in the West, WHO WILL GO? Is it you? Is God speaking to you? We need God-called individuals to be pastors, discipleship ministers (teachers), music ministers, lay people, and of course outreach ministers (evangelist). Secondly, there is the Funding Need! It cost to reach the Lost. We operate financially independent. There is no conference of churches or associations that fund us as a whole. Many people and churches from all kinds of groups help all the time and we are so thankful. This endeavor to reach the West is a big undertaking and will require much more funding than we presently have in our typical support funds. So will you help? We estimate we need about \$1500-\$1800/month to relaunch the SLC work and help me be stationed there more often. These estimated funds are for RV parking and to assist with conference room or church sanctuary rent where we can hold church services. It is not for funding personal salaries, only the housing and meeting place needs. It is \$1124/mo to park the motorhome by the month in SLC, as apposed to \$2000+/mo by the week. We have encountered a lot of recent projects on the motorhome. Furnace replacement, floors needed addition support installed in compartments and new plywood and vinyl. Praise God, David Fisher found my rear breaks were ground down to the steel and had destroyed the rotors. The windshield cracked and needed replacement. With all these repairs over the last two month, we have spent over \$3000 that was not in our travel budget. So if you want to help with these expenses, designate your offering "MH Repairs" We also need to replace the two front tires before they blowout too, they are around 8+ yrs old and will cost over \$900 to replace.

The Lord willing, Mission Trip 75 kicks off on Nov. 5th from PA to OH, MI, IN, MO, NM, & UT. Please pray for our deputation and ministries on the way west and an outreach weekend in Gallup, NM.
